

In the local papers, news of the purchase was writ large with editions of the Halstead Gazette, Sudbury Mercury and Haverhill Echo carrying the story, with it also featuring in the online edition of the EADT.

Parish Footpaths Group

Eight walkers welcomed in 2013 with a walk on New Year's Day. It was a beautiful morning with the sun shining and a cloudless blue sky. Because of the pretty wet conditions the route chosen was mainly on the farm roads and the highway but this did not detract from the pleasure of enjoying a bracing walk around our beautiful Parish.

The County Enforcement Officer spent a day in the Parish to advise us on the way forward with our Parish Paths. Three footpath signs that had fallen over have been replaced and advice given on how to make more accessible cross field paths and field edge paths. Cross field paths are entirely the responsibility of the land owners and should be reinstated within 14 days of cultivation.

The maintenance of the surface of field edge paths is the responsibility of Highways, but the field edge path should be a minimum of a metre and half wide and the hedge if there is one, should be faced back. These issues are the responsibility of the land owner. However we do have to take into consideration the appalling weather this Autumn and the heavy soil that we have in Toppesfield.



There are two applications in to divert the course of footpaths, one surrounding the concrete farm road near Berwick Hall Wood and the other around Bradfields. It does take a long time for applications to be sorted but hopefully both will be addressed in the New Year. Once this has been passed we can then set about creating maps of walks in the Parish.

Please note that if you see some problem with roads such as potholes developing, you can report it on the Essex County Council website. Its quite easy to do. Even I can do it! If you come across a problem with a footpath, please contact me so that I can go through the correct channels. Enjoy your walking!


New Club 'Golden Chestnuts' is born!




